



Adnan Ibrahimbegovic studied Civil Engineering at University of Sarajevo, graduating with the highest honors (first in class), and carried on with doctoral studies at University of California, Berkeley with a Fullbright fellowship in 1986. He obtained his PhD in 1989, and stayed at UC Berkeley as a post-doc for another 1,5 year. In 1997, he obtained Habilitation in Mechanics at University of Pierre and Marie Curie (Paris 6). He held teaching and research positions at University of Sarajevo, Ecole Polytechnique Fédérale de Lausanne, Switzerland and Université de Technologie de Compiègne, France. Since 1999, at Ecole Normale Supérieure de Cachan, one of the elite institutions ('Grandes Ecoles') in Paris, he served as Head of Teaching and Research Department of Civil Engineering, and Head of Master Program. In 2009, he was promoted by the National Committee of Universities (CNU) to Professor 'Classe Exceptionnelle', the highest honors in French system of higher education. He was awarded Humboldt Research Award in 2005, IACM Fellow Award in 2006 and Slovenian Research Award in 2007. He has authored more than 150 journal papers. He is the author and editor of 5 books, 4 in English published by Springer and IOS Press and one in French published by Hermes-Science-Lavoisier (nominated for Roberval Award for the best university textbooks in 2008).
